Admissions Procedure for Grace Christian School

Thank you for your interest in Grace Christian School. At GCS we are committed to partnering with the home and church to provide children an unparalleled quality education, resulting in wisdom, strength of character, life-long devotion and adherence to God, and the fulfillment of their mission in life.

Please take the time to complete this application process. Do not hesitate to contact our office if you have any questions or difficulty completing the forms.

Probationary admission to GCS is based on your application, grades, academic/readiness testing, and in some cases a personal interview with parent(s)/guardian(s) and student(s). Students seeking admission directly following an expulsion, suspension or behavioural issues at another school will not be eligible for admission until the board of Grace Christian School and all parties are perfectly satisfied that GCS is able to help such a student and enrolment is in the best interest of the student.

Adherence to these standards allows families and their students to understand our commitment to train children in the way they should go, and to secure a commitment to life-long devotion, fidelity and adherence to God, and His plans and purposes for them.

Admission to GCS involves a two or three-step process:

Step one – Application

1. Family Application for Admission form (one per family).
2. Student Application form (one per student).

To activate your application, the GCS office must receive both items 1 and 2, along with a \$130.00/family non-refundable application fee. (The fee is \$70 for Grace Christian Preschool students applying into grade 1.)

Step Two – Personal Interview (At the discretion of the GCS administration)

An interview might be scheduled once we receive and process all the required forms and materials along with the application fee.

Step Three – Notification & enrolment

Applicants will be accepted on the basis of a complete review of the academic information, reference forms, and the personal interview, if one is scheduled and conducted. A confirmation letter (or email) will be sent to all applicants

within one week of completion of the application process to notify you if your child has been accepted. Tuition is due once your child has been accepted. Please make out and submit ten (10) post-dated cheques (September 1 – June 1) to **Grace Christian School**. Successful applicants beyond the number we are able to accept will be placed in a waiting list, and duly notified when space becomes available.

The Director is responsible for carrying out the admissions policies established by the board of Grace Capstone Ministries Inc. The Director's decision is binding, except when parents seek an exception to the policy, in which case they may appeal to the GCMi board in writing. All admissions decisions made by the GCMi board are final and not subject to an appeal process.

Grace Christian School does not at this time have the resources to adequately provide proper education regarding certain special needs students.

We encourage parents to keep their accounts current. Parents with outstanding balances will receive a statement to that effect. Action will be taken on accounts that are 60 days past due. Records of students withdrawing or transferring to other institutions will not be released until all outstanding amounts have been cleared up. Grace Christian School does not issue refunds for portions of unused monthly tuition, so students withdrawing or transferring are encouraged to give proper notice, and plan to effect their transfer at the end of a given month.

Parents should expect to incur additional expenses such as individual student supply fees, some elective courses, field trips, etc.

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Statement of Faith

Grace Christian School is an interdenominational Christian School whose mission is to **partner** with the **home** and **church** to provide children an unparalleled quality education, resulting in wisdom, strength of character, life-long devotion, and adherence to God, and the fulfillment of their mission in life.

At Grace Christian School we adhere to the main creeds of Christianity:

Apostles' Creed: **We** believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth. **And** in Jesus Christ His only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sits on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. **We** believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic Church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. **AMEN.**

Nicene Creed: **We** believe in one God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, And of all things visible and invisible: **And** in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, Begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of very God, Begotten, not made, Being of one substance with the Father, By whom all things were made; Who for us men, and for our salvation came down from heaven, And was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, And was made man, And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried, And the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, And ascended into heaven, And sits on the right hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead: Whose kingdom shall have no end. **And** we believe in the Holy Ghost, The Lord and giver of life, Who proceeds from the Father and the Son, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, Who spoke by the Prophets. **And** we believe one Catholic and Apostolic Church. **We** acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins. And we look for the Resurrection of the dead, And the life of the world to come. **AMEN.**

In the Spirit-filled tradition, we believe in the baptism of the Holy Spirit, and His empowering of believers to witness to the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

We believe: that every individual is created in the image & likeness of God; that our entire worth stems from this & nothing else; that before conception God prepared a unique plan for every individual; that one's life hasn't really begun until one has accepted Jesus Christ as personal Lord & Saviour; that every believer needs regular & consistent interaction with other believers, in a local church, as directed by the Holy Spirit; that in order for one to be happy, fulfilled & successful, one must discover & begin doing God's plan for one's life; that one must cultivate a personal, intimate, daily relationship with Jesus in order to discover & ultimately fulfill this plan; that parents have a mandate from God to educate their children in His way; that the church & church-school are to partner with & assist parents in the education of their children, discovery of their God-given assignment, & its ultimate fulfillment.



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Code of Ethics

Do your best to live in peace with everyone (Ro 12.18 NCV). Most importantly, love each other deeply, because love will cause people to forgive each other for many sins (1Pe 4.8).

As we, parents, teachers, students, work with each other at school or on committees, we come to know more about each other. We learn about each other's strengths and weaknesses. Sometimes, deliberately or inadvertently, we share confidential information. This Code of Ethics tells you how we, the school, will handle information, and how we expect you to handle it.

- ✓ Teachers will discuss students' achievements or challenges only with those who need to know. A student's individual weaknesses will not become common knowledge.
- ✓ Volunteers who work directly with students will discuss achievements and/or challenges only with the student's teacher. Great care will be taken to avoid discussing student's achievements/challenges in casual conversation with other teachers, parents or students (including their own children).
- ✓ Teacher's grade books and student's personal files are confidential. Volunteers will have access to these only when absolutely necessary to properly document a student's progress and facilitate the smooth running of a classroom.
- ✓ Teachers will talk to parents about their student's progress in private, without other students, parents or teachers present or within earshot. An exception will be made at those times a witness is needed to corroborate an account of an event.
- ✓ Teachers using volunteers to work with groups or individual students will share only information necessary to facilitate the volunteer's work and enhance the student's learning experience. Volunteers will report directly to the teacher, or the director, in the absence of the teacher.
- ✓ Parents, teachers, staff or students will refrain from talking about other parents, teachers, staff or students (2Co 12.20, 1Pe 2.1). Differences of opinion or concerns will be taken up directly with the individual involved (Mt 18.15, Lu 17.3-4). When and if necessary, help in resolving difficult situations will be sought first from the school administration rather than other (outside) individuals (Mt 18.16-19, Ac 15.6, 1Co 6.1-4).
- ✓ Proper caution will be taken not to use names in general discussions among teachers, staff or committee members.
- ✓ Teachers, committee and board members will keep discussions and decisions made at meetings confidential.

Everyone working with Grace Christian School will endeavour to speak words of encouragement and build up students, teachers, staff, parents, board and committee members. Challenges and concerns will be brought up with those directly involved and will not become general knowledge (Mt 18.15-17, Lu 17.1-4). We will at all times guard the integrity of Grace Christian School and all those associated with it, and preserve a wholesome work and learning environment by **stepping in and stopping conversations that are out of place** (Ps 101.5).



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Dress Code

And the parts we regard as less honorable are those we clothe with the greatest care. So we carefully protect those parts that should not be seen, (1Co 12.23 NLTSe)

Test all things; hold fast what is good. 22 Abstain from every form of evil. 23 Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely; and may your whole spirit, soul, and body be preserved blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. 24 He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it (1Th 5.21-24 NKJV).

- ✓ School is the student's workplace. The key words regarding dress at school are: **modest, clean, neat, and functional**. In the school/work environment, depending on the situation, appropriate clothing will range from casual – business casual – upscale casual, with appropriate footwear. Such clothing will meet the above stated goals without distracting others from their work or becoming a topic of conversation. Staff will set the example by modelling such clothing within and outside school.
- ✓ Students are not to wear clothes with offensive slogans or pictures, or that advertise tobacco or liquor products.
- ✓ Students are not to wear torn or sloppy clothes which often encourage careless behaviour.
- ✓ Shorts and skirts should be modest in appearance and length.
- ✓ Tank tops and "spaghetti" straps are not appropriate classroom wear for either boys or girls.
- ✓ Extremely baggy or tight clothes that limit movement or reveal parts that should be covered (1Co 12.23) are inappropriate.
- ✓ Bare midriffs are not acceptable.
- ✓ Pants must be pulled up so that underwear is not showing.
- ✓ Headwear, such as caps, bandannas, toques, etc., are not to be worn inside the school.
- ✓ Gang-related clothing or paraphernalia, including Goth dress are not allowed.
- ✓ With the exception of ear rings for girls (one per ear), facial piercings of any type are not permitted.
- ✓ Boy's hair should be kept short as is proper and fitting for boys, so that they are not mistaken for girls.
- ✓ In order to help keep our school as clean as possible, students are expected to have two pairs of shoes, one for inside wear and one for outside wear. Students unable to have two pairs of shoes on a particular day should inform their teacher.
- ✓ Neither bare feet nor stocking feet are permitted in school.
- ✓ Students are expected to dress according to the weather so that when possible, they can spend time outside during recess and lunch. In extremely cold weather, students who wish to do so may participate in indoor activities during recess and noon hour.
- ✓ Gym clothes (T-shirt and shorts, or sweat top and pants) & "good condition" running shoes, with non-marking soles, are to be worn during gym.
- ✓ Discretion about proper dress and appearance is the overall responsibility of the school administration.

I/we commit to faithfully pray for and support Grace Christian School, students, staff, administration, volunteers and board, as it partners with me/us to educate my/our child(ren).

When and if necessary, help in resolving difficult situations will be sought first from the school administration rather than other (outside) individuals (Mt 18.16-19, Ac 15.6, 1Co 6.1-9). In the event of clear violation of Canadian laws, I/we will take the matter to court.

I/we agree that any pictures, video statements, and recognition of achievements taken during the course of the school year become the property of GCS, and may be used for future promotion, including but not limited to promotion in newsletters, websites, brochures, and parent publications.

Grace Christian School reserves the right to dismiss my/our student if he/she does not respect its spiritual standards, cooperate in the educational program or if I/we do not support school policies.

Grace Christian School is an overtly Christian educational institution. Grace Christian School is for students who are committed to the principles of Christian life and conduct clearly laid out in the Bible - God's Word.

Your signature on this form is your commitment to abide by Grace Christian School's guidelines as communicated below* and to conduct yourself appropriately at school and outside school. Grace Christian School recognizes that while man-made regulations cannot improve an individual's standing with Christ, they strengthen your life and testimony, and reflect on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, your home, church, and the school you represent.

I commit to following Biblical standards of behaviour, attitudes, and belief. I have an obligation to live by the Spirit and not according to my flesh (Ro 8.1, 4). Therefore, I commit to abide by these guidelines* and rules as long as I am enrolled at Grace Christian School. I understand that recurring failure in any of these areas may terminate my enrolment at Grace Christian School.

1. The second greatest commandment is to love my neighbour as myself (Mr 12.31). Love does no harm to others, so love fulfills the requirements of God's law (Ro 13.10). If/when I have an issue with another student, teacher, coach or parent, I will go first go to them directly to resolve the matter (Mt 18.15, Lu 17.3-4). If I am unable to, I will go to a teacher or administrator for help in resolving the matter (Mt 18.16-20).
2. I recognize that enrolment & education at Grace Christian School is a privilege, and I will strive to be a positive influence in the lives of my fellow students and teachers (Pr 20.11, Pr 27.17). I will seek to build up my fellow students and teachers with my words and actions rather than tear them down (Eph 4.29-32). When corrected by a staff member, I will accept such correction with an attitude of humility and repentance (Pr 10.17, 15.32)
3. I will avoid profane, blasphemous and/or derogatory language and gestures (1Ti 6.20, Eph 4.29). I will avoid speaking negatively behind anyone's back, whether verbally or through any form of written communication or body language (Pr 16.28, 2Ti 3.1-5), whether at home or at school (Ecc 10.20, Ja 1.26).
4. I understand that the Internet is public domain and that I may be held accountable for anything I write or view on it at home or at school. I agree to use the Internet at school only for school related activities (1Pe 2.16).
5. I will display the fruits of the Spirit (Gal 5.22-23). Uncontrolled anger, hatred, sexual harassment, or prejudice based on race, socio-economic status or appearance is unacceptable and will not be part of my conduct (Ga 5.19-21).
6. I will strive to follow the directions of teachers at Grace Christian School, with an attitude of respect and submission, including consistency in completing assignments on time. I understand that the aim of education at Grace Christian School is to train me up (spiritually, intellectually and physically) in God's way (Pr 22.6) and start me on the road to fulfilling my mission in life (2Ti 4.7). I will cooperate with my teachers to accomplish this goal (He 13.17).
